


Social Life

History & Heritage



1793

The Meynell family purchase the Hoar Cross Estate from the Honourable Charles Talbot, which included a mansion on the current site

1863

Hugo Francis Meynell Ingram marries the Honourable Emily Charlotte, daughter of Sir Charles Wood, 1st Viscount of Halifax. Over the coming years, the New Hall was built for the family to reside in.

1872

After Hugo lost his life in a riding accident, his widow built the Hoar Cross Church in his memory

1888

Part of the Old Hall was converted for use as an orphanage for boys, who sang in the church choir and were altar boys for the church. The Old Hall was renamed St Michael's House, and Hoar Cross House, constructed in 1865 became The New Hall.

1987

The property was converted and extended into a care home after many years as a Church of England Children's Home

2004

The home was taken over by the current owners who has made considerable investment over the years to improve and extend the property and facilities, bringing what the home has to offer to its residents up to the exceedingly high standard of today.
